Thanks to Mrs. Wood for the invitation to share with her Social Studies class. Experiencing the students' excellent questions makes me excited for the future of Rosthern!

Compost pickup

Every Tuesday (May 1-November 6)

Compost materials may be placed in containers or plastic bags and must be at the curb prior to 7:00 a.m. Containers weighing over 50 pounds will NOT be picked up.

The following are acceptable compost materials:

- grass clippings
- garden waste
- leaves
- weeds
- fruit and vegetable waste
- sawdust
- coffee grounds/filters
- tea bags
- eggshells

Branches must be in 3-foot lengths

Please do not place meat, dairy products or bones in your compost bag.
